

Born This Month in History



MADAM C. J.
WALKER (1867 –
1919)- was an
American
entrepreneur,
philanthropist, and
political and social
activist. Creating a

hair care industry for African Americans, becoming the first female self-made millionaire in America as noted in the Guinness Book of World Records. Born on December 23, 1867, in the Louisiana Delta plantation where her parents were enslaved before the end of the Civil War.



BILL PICKET (1870–1932) - He was the originator of rodeo steer wrestling, or bulldogging. In Texas he formed a horse breaking business with his brother that advertised "catching"

and taming wild cattle as a specialty". In 1905 he joined the Miller Brothers 101 Ranch Wild West Show for over a quarter century. He went on to perform in several motion pictures and is credited with being the first Black cowboy star.

≨OCIAL SECURITY CHANGES 2026

Social Security recipients will get a 2.8% cost-ofliving adjustment (COLA), translating to a \$60 monthly increase for many beneficiaries.

Medicare premiums and out-of-pocket costs will increase: Many Social Security beneficiaries also rely on Medicare. For 2026, premium costs — especially for Medicare Part B — are rising, which may diminish the net benefit of the COLA increase.

CITY RETIRES SUE OVER HEALTH CARE

NYC employees and retirees have filed a lawsuit to stop the Adams' administration from moving roughly 750,000 workers and dependents into a new self-funded health plan (NYCE PPO) starting January 1, 2026.

The petitioners argue the plan violates the city's legal duty to provide "health insurance" and would strip them of state insurance protections.

The city and major unions say the plan preserves premium-free coverage and saves about \$1 billion annually.

New York City is reopening a pathway for roughly 2,900 former municipal employees who were fired for refusing the COVID-19 vaccine to return to their old job titles at current pay.

Adams Promises 5,000 New NYPD Officers

Mayor Eric Adams plans to increase NYPD's ranks to 40,000 officers within three years, the highest level in about 20 years.

NYPD's main union argues this boost won't solve the problem because officers are leaving almost as fast as they're being hired, driven by workload, morale, and pay issues.

CITY ANNOUNCES \$7 BILLION LABOR AGREEMENT

New York City recently approved a roughly US\$7 billion labor agreement — via new project labor agreements (PLAs) — that is expected to prioritize community hiring.

Key public-works projects (libraries, recreation centers, water treatment facilities) will create apprenticeship and opportunities for underserved and low-income communities. The goal is to deliver critical infrastructure and a pathway to middle-class union careers for New Yorkers.




